## Colloquium (for PhD candidates only)

The main motivation of conducting colloquium (Evaluation 2) for PhD candidates is **to ensure the quality of the findings and analysis of the PhD thesis** for Faculty of Applied Sciences and Technology (FAST) postgraduate candidates are up to PhD level.

## **Procedure and Process**

1. The colloquium is compulsory for all PhD candidates

Full time studentSemester 3 or semester 4 (2<sup>nd</sup> year of study)Part time studentSemester 7 or semester 8 (4<sup>th</sup> year of study)

- 2. The participation of PhD candidate in the colloquium session is strictly dependent of the nomination from their research advisor.
- 3. The research advisor also needs to provide the committee with the details listed below

\*the proposed examiners (2 in total) are preferably an Associate Professor Dr or Professor Dr.

- 4. The **examiners** can only give recommendations or suggestions on the research activity (methodology and data analysis) **without changing the overall direction of the study.**
- 5. The **students** need to submit the **abstract** to the faculty **3 weeks before** the actual date of the colloquium.

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- 6. The students' colloquium presentation (time allocated : 15 minutes for presentation followed by 30 minutes Q&A session) are strictly on
  - (a) Brief overview and significances of study
  - (b) Objectives of study
  - (c) Prominent findings and data analysis
  - (d) Comprehensive conclusions
